ALL 540 BIXI OPUS SMART STATIONS NOW IN SERVICE

Montreal, July 6, 2017 - This morning was the official launch of the 540 BIXI OPUS smart stations that allow you to rent a BIXI using your OPUS card. To mark the occasion, Mr. Aref Salem, head of transport for the executive committee of the City of Montreal, Mr. Marc-André Gadoury, special advisor in charge of the cycling dossier for the City of Montreal, Ms. Marie Elaine Farley, chairperson of the BIXI MONTRÉAL board of directors, and Mr. Philippe Schnobb, chairman of the STM (Société de transport de Montréal) board of directors, were all present at the Papineau metro BIXI station.

"The future is in integrated mobility and technological innovations. The City of Montreal is committed to helping those who choose to use sustainable mobility. The new BIXI OPUS smart stations are in line with this trend and show the determination of different collective transport players to make this service available to Montrealers. We can all be proud of this great collaboration between the STM, BIXI MONTRÉAL and the transportation organizations. It is a great example of synergy working to benefit all BIXI users as of today!" declared Mr. Aref Salem, head of transport for the executive committee of the City of Montreal.

"We are all here today with a common goal: to make collective transport more accessible. We are proud to be the first city in North America to offer such a service, linking public transit and the bikesharing service. From now on, OPUS cardholders from all across Quebec will be able to use their OPUS card at any BIXI station in Montreal, Longueuil or Westmount to buy a one-way BIXI pass," added BIXI MONTRÉAL's chairperson, Ms. Farley.

REGISTER AT BIXI.COM FOR EASY RENTAL ACCESS ALL SUMMER LONG!

In addition to speeding up the rental process at BIXI pay stations, this new access method does not require the customer to make a deposit payment. Using their credit card, OPUS cardholders must first register online on the BIXI website, under the section BECOME A MEMBER -> OPUS. Once they have filled out the online form, their OPUS card will be ready to use right away at any of the 540 stations in the network. Customers can go straight to the pay station and get a code to unlock a bike using the new touchless readers. Usage conditions are the same as usual: customers can get as many one-way passes for 30 minutes or less as they would like, at \$2.95 each, tax included.

OPUS cards issued by these transport companies are valid at BIXI stations: STM, RTM, RTC (Québec), Société de transport de Lévis, Réseau de transport de Longueuil and the Société de transport de Laval.





BIXI STILL AS POPULAR AS EVER IN 2017

The BIXI OPUS smart stations are being introduced while the Montreal bike-sharing system is as popular as ever. The year 2016 was marked by new records and higher usage rates in all categories. As of June 30, 2017, the number of trips, new customers and purchases was again at an all-time high. The numbers have increased by 8.5%, 35% and 10.8%, respectively, compared to the same time last year.

"The demand is there. There are more than a million people that use bikes daily here. That is what makes Montreal the first bike-friendly city in North America," commented Mr. Marc-André Gadoury, special advisor in charge of the cycling dossier for the City of Montreal.

"We hope that this new BIXI access method with OPUS cards will encourage more visitors and Montrealers to use the BIXI service to get around this summer!" declared Ms. Farley.

BIXI-STM COLLABORATION: A BIG STEP TOWARDS BROADER INTEGRATED MOBILITY

"In a time when we are talking about integrated mobility more and more, it's important to develop projects that promote complementary modes of transport. The BIXI OPUS smart stations are definitely a good example of that. These types of collaborations are essential to make our customers' lives easier and to encourage them to use our services even more," said Mr. Philippe Schnobb, chairman of the STM board of directors.

Some other projects resulting from BIXI and STM's collaboration are BIXI keys being available at three STM service points (Lionel-Groulx, Jean-Talon and Berri-UQAM), BIXI stations being located in close proximity to the metro and trains, as well as BIXI being added to the STM trip planner.

The BIXI OPUS project was made possible thanks to the hard work and collaboration of the transport organizations associated with OPUS (STM, RTM, STL, RTL, RTC, Société de transport de Lévis), and a special thanks to the technical teams at the STM, BIXI and 8D Technologies.
